SAMUEL “RIDDLE” DIES AT GLEN RIDDLE – For Half a Century Manager of the Textile Mills – Death Due to Paralysis

Samuel Riddle an aged resident of Glen Riddle, died at his home on Sunday night, well advanced in years. Mr. Riddle has been in feeble health for seven years past, and on Saturday evening he was seized by a paralytic stroke, and was unconscious from that time until his death. He was well known throughout the county, and was for half a century manager of the Glen Riddle mills.

Mr. Riddle is survived by a widow and ten children, as follows: Mrs. George H. Laird of Lanes' Mills, Jefferson County, Pa.; Mrs. George Stetser of Clifton; Mrs. Keuben H.
