

Francis Harvey Green artifacts

Dr. Francis Harvey Green was born in 1861 and raised in Bethel Township. His parents were Sharpless and Mary Booth Green. He became an educator, poet and lecturer.

In 1952 *Francis Harvey Green School* was built and named in his honor, however Dr. Green died just prior to its dedication. The School displayed many of Dr. Green's personal collections. In 1991 the School was rented to the Delaware County Intermediate Unit and Principal Joseph Bruton had one display case of Dr. Green's possessions and an additional case with items relating to Bethel relocated to the new Garnet Valley Middle School. In 2010 the *Francis Harvey Green School* was razed.

The two cases with artifacts are now on display for the public to view. One case holds arrowheads, stone tools presumably used by local Indian tribes, some quartz, which was gathered locally and other stones and mementos from around the country. One interesting item is the lock from the front door of the Booth's Corner General Store. The second cabinet holds some of Dr. Green's personal items as well as Bethel Township School District plaques & documents. The
