A wave of religious concern spread over the country from 1830 to 1835 and the increase in membership in the denominations led to an unusual activity in church building; in which the Methodists took the lead in Delaware County. It was during this period that the Lima Church came into existence. From this neighborhood the folk mostly attended Stony Bank or Mount Hope Churches. Several became converted and by 1833 a class was formed-the seventh in the county. In this class, effecting the church organization, were William L. Fox and his sister Eleanor, James Permar, John Pyle and four others-two of whom, probably, were Ellen Hughes and Mira McCally. This new church society was placed in charge of James Riddle, and at first met at the home of William L. Fox, in the angle of the Lima road, opposite the store. After about six months an old frame building, a schoolhouse on the Smedley property, standing at the forks of the road about a quarter mile west of the Black Horse Tavern was rented, and services held in it by the circuit preachers. Here the worshippers suffered much annoyance. Upon one occasion some sons of Belial climbing up on the roof placed boards over the chimney and smoked the congregation out. But they soon grew in numbers sufficient to secure a church of their own. On August 19th, 1835, for seventy-five dollars, John Rattew conveyed to Henry Permer, Charles McCalley, John Pyle, Lewis M. Pike, John Daniels, Seth Rigby, William L. Fox, of Middletown; Caleb G. Archer, of Aston; and Joshua Smith, of Edgmont, Trustees, one acre of ground. On this they built a stone meeting house. This, in rebuilding in 1873, was enlarged. It was dedicated on Sunday, April 6th, 1873. The society was incorporated March 23rd, 1874, as "Lima Methodist Episcopal Church."

Joseph Parsons, then 18 years old, joined the class of '33 and remained a member of this church until his death, in 1901—a period of 68 years. He was intimately associated with it as local preacher, class leader and Sunday School superintendent. His wife was Ellen Hughes—mentioned above.

Joseph Iliff was a class leader here half century ago.

Edward Gill is the present pastor.

William W. Turner, its Sunday School superintendent, was an early member of Kedron Church and a former resident of Springfield township.
