NORWOOD BRICK PLANT HAS BEEN DISMANLED – Costly Machinery That Was Installed About Ten Years Ago Disposed of as Junk

The old Norwood brick plant, which was managed for a number of years by the late Charles Shuster, has been completely divested of the costly machinery that was installed in the plant about ten years ago. The machinery, which included a large engine a mammoth fly wheel and four boilers and which was originally installed at a cost of \$100,000, was sold as junk to the Norristown Iron and Steel Company. The engine and fly wheel had to be broken by the use of dynamite. The material was hauled to the freight station at Prospect Park by G.W. Moore & Company, and four large freight cars were required in shipping the material to Norristown.
