HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS FORM COUNTRY CLUB – Graduates of Other Years Purchase a House at Llanerch – Indoor and Outdoor Sports

The Alumnae Association of the Girls' High and Normal Schools of Philadelphia, has secured grounds at Llanerch in this county, and successfully started a country club of a thoroughly modern character. Several acres of adjacent ground are devoted to golf, tennis, croquet and other popular outdoor sports.

The club house is a large three-storied, ivy-covered mansion, containing reception rooms, library, sun parlors and artistically arranged cozy corners. On the second floor there is a well-equipped billiard and pool room.

Mrs. George W. Kendrick, Jr., is president of the organization and Mrs. G. Estarbrook, Jr., is recording secretary. Other officers are: Vice presidents, Mrs. Henry T. Hollowell, Dr. L.W. Wilson and Mrs. William F. Anderson; treasurer, Mrs. Charles G. Saul; corresponding secretary, Mrs. B. Frank Johnston.

The Alumnae Association includes 200 members. The club celebrated its opening on June 1. A lawn fete, the first of a series of entertainments, will be given on the spacious grounds surrounding the club house this afternoon.
