EIGHT NEW HOUSES TO BE BUILT AT LANSDOWNE – George W. Statzell Begins the Erection of Large Dwellings on tract of Land in the Borough

George W. Statzell of Garrettford, has started operations on eight large and handsome dwelling houses on his big tract of land on Lansdowne Avenue and the Garrettford Road, this borough. William Saunders, who for a number of years has been employed as foreman for W.C. Shuster, Jr., the Lansdowne builder, will superintend the work on these buildings. An old barn which is on the tract will be fitted up as a planning mill where all the material for the new houses will be turned out. It is understood that Mr. Statzell intends to erect a very large number of houses on this tract early next spring. The tract is situated along the line of the Philadelphia and Garrettford Street Railway Company and is close to Lansdowne Avenue trolley station. This is an ideal place and no doubt a small-sized town will soon loom up on the tract, which will be another big boom for Lansdowne.
